

Principal Report

Welcome back to the 2022 school year. Whilst we were all hopeful of returning to school with fewer COVID-19 restrictions we find ourselves returning to the same restrictions we finished the 2021 school year with, and with a few additions such as the introduction of Rapid Antigen Testing. As always, we greatly appreciate your support with all of structures we have put in place to keep our students and staff safe. Some of these measures include-

Stage Bubbles - The school is managed with the creation of Stage Bubbles. To keep all students and staff safe, at no time of the school day do any Stage Bubbles mingle or share spaces. Daily events such as lunch and recess, visiting toilets, RFF and moving around that school are all completed within each stage bubble.

Stage Gates for drop off and Pick ups-

Designated gates for drop offs and pick ups are necessary to ensure that Stage Bubbles are maintained at all times of the day. Whilst we understand that this may cause some frustration with multiple gates it is a necessary measure that students and staff have all managed well. The designated gates and staggered bell times are -

Rapid Antigen Testing - Staff and students have all been provided with Rapid Antigen Tests to complete every Monday and Wednesday.

- · If your child has even mild COVID-19 symptoms, get them tested with a RAT or PCR (nose and throat swab) test.
- · They must isolate until they receive a negative test result, in line with health protocols.
- · If symptoms continue, they should stay at home and take another RAT in 24 hours or have a PCR test. If the second RAT or initial PCR test result is negative, or another diagnosis is confirmed such as hay fever, they can return to school.
- · Inform the school and Service NSW if a positive result is returned.

It is recommended that staff and students that return to school after recovering from COVID-19 do not participate in rapid antigen test surveillance for 28 days (four weeks after recovery) following release from self-isolation. This is due to NSW Health advice that people who have recovered from COVID-19 have a low risk of contracting it again in the following 28 days. After 28 days (from week five after recovery) staff and students may resume participation in RAT surveillance.

Thankyou to all of the staff involved in preparing, packing and distributing the RAT tests in their holidays. Your time and dedication is greatly appreciated.

Thank you to all of the parents / carers and school community for your support in collecting and more importantly, administering the RAT tests with your children. I know this isn't an easy task... thank you.

Communication regarding positive cases - The school will inform stage groups or the whole school community of positive cases of staff or students within the school community. This is not cause for alarm. The best advice I can give you is to be vigilant in monitoring your children for symptoms. You know your children best, if

they present with symptoms such as fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, extreme tiredness, unexplained chest pain or conjunctivitis (eye infection) then do a Rapid Antigen Test or take them to do a PCR test. Please do not send your children to school with any of the above symptoms as unfortunately they cannot attend. You will be contacted and asked to pick your child / children up if they are presenting with any symptoms.

Bike Safety- It is fantastic to seeing students riding their bikes or scooters to school each morning. When riding a bike or scooter to school, it is a requirement by law that a helmet is worn.

We have recently had m any reports from parents of close calls on the roads as students on scooters cross roads in an unsafe manner putting themselves at great risk.

Protect your head

Bicycle riders are required by law to wear an approved helmet securely fitted and fastened. In NSW there are no exemptions from wearing an approved bicycle helmet.

Research conducted by the University of NSW in 2016 involving 64,000 injured cyclists found helmet use was associated with about a 50 per cent reduction in head injuries of any severity, about a 70 per cent reduction in serious head injuries and 65 per cent reduction in fatal head injuries. A bicycle helmet that is not correctly fitted and fastened does not provide enough protection in a crash.

Parents Running Late


We realise from time to time parents run late to pick up their child from school. Please remember if you phone the school at 3pm it is difficult to get a message to your child.


Please try to let your child know in the morning before school if normal arrangements have been changed prior to them coming to school.
